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ONE OF THE BIGGEST goals of the project was to make better use of the space by creating something with a more open concept, and including a place to sit and eat. That meant the first step was completely clearing the space, bringing down the separation between the kitchen and dining rooms, and starting with a blank canvas. A lot of time was spent with the empty room, laying out drafts with masking tape and moving them around to ensure the final design would be perfect, since they hoped to keep it for a long time. In the end, they completely flipped the space, moving the kitchen into the dining room and changing the former kitchen into a matching workspace.

Simply Stunning



Lisa and Darren Leblanc were hoping to replace their kitchen with something a little more modern. The project wasn't simple - in fact, it ended up completely transforming the space. Working with Lorie Martin Pessot of kitchENvision, they devised a brand new custom kitchen with an entirely new look and feel and indeed a new layout too. It took a lot of research and a lot of work, but the result is this elegant and spacious kitchen that bears little resemblance to the room as it stood before.





The old blue countertop was replaced with a more modern polished granite. For an extra note of luxury, the island sink was outfitted with touch-activated stainless steel faucets that spring to life with a brush of the fingertips. The fixture is just one part of a motif of stainless steel that is carried through the kitchen by the appliances and, more subtly but with great effect, the cabinet handles.



Both Lisa and Darren have large families, and their house happens to sit at the most central location for many of their relatives, so their house frequently plays host to big gatherings. As practiced entertainers know, most parties end up in the kitchen, so eating space was a high priority in this renovation, and an extra-large island with a wide overhang to accommodate seating was the answer.





What used to be the kitchen is now this cozy corner of the open concept room, where additional cabinetry provides display cases, lots of extra storage space and a compact built-in computer desk with natural lighting. S
